

Rubio Márquez : Strength, a characteristic of Mexican economy

Mexico, Oct. 13 (Notimex) .- The central characteristic of the Mexican economy is its strength in the face of internal and external shocks, including the natural phenomena that recently affected the country, underscored the Deputy Minister of Finance and Public Credit, Vanessa Rubio Márquez.

This, by participating in the panel "The Future of Global Economic Growth and Cooperation" of the Bretton Woods Committee, as part of her visit to the city of Washington, D.C., the Finance and Public Credit Ministry (SHCP, for its acronym in Spanish), referred in a statement.

She also met with market representatives including insurer Metlife, Citi bank and Fitch Ratings agency, to whom she exposed the current state of the Mexican economy and the economic policies that have allowed growth, employment and domestic economic activity.

As part of the annual meetings of the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund, the Deputy Minister of Finance and Public Credit participated in the World Economic Forum (WEF) event.

There, the subject of personal data handled by public and private financial institutions, cybersecurity, analysis of large data, interoperable databases and information transfer was discussed, said the Deputy Minister.

Rubio Márquez also represented the branch on the first day of activities of the Group of 20 (G20), which addressed the global economic scenario and the challenges to promote sustainable development based on three pillars: sound fiscal and monetary policies and the implementation of structural reforms.
